Scientific Name : Zea mays

Import Conditions :

1. Import Permit / Licence is to be sought from the relevant Government Ministry of Malaysia.
2. Consignments must be accompanied with Phytosanitary Certificate (PC) certifying treatment details from the country of origin issued within 14 days prior to dispatch of the consignments. Quarantine treatment certificate and a record of quarantine treatment sheet attached to the PC stating the reference number of the treatment certificate.
3. A copy of this Import Permit (IP) must be sent to the consignor and must accompany the consignment.
4. Consignments must be free from soil and pest.
5. Consignments are subjected to visual inspection, examination or analysis prior to clearance by MAQIS officer upon arrival at the point of entry into Malaysia.
6. Source of consignments and processing / packing house must be located in the area free from South American Leaf Blight (SALB) (*Microcyclus ulei*). Minimum 50 km away from rubber tree.

Treatment :

Fumigation with methyl bromide under normal atmospheric pressure at 32 gm/m³ for 24 hours at or above 21°C or Phosphine at 3gm/m³ for 120 hours.

The target of the fumigation must not be wrapped in or coated with materials that are impervious to methyl bromide.

Additional Declarations :

1. NPPO must declare in the PC that The consignment has been sourced from properly inspected area and free from pests, diseases and other regulated articles .
2. The consignment has been treated and verified in compliance with the IP.

Other Requirements :

1. Product source and processing / packing house must be located in the area free from SALB spore (minimum from 50 km away from rubber tree). NPPO must include this Additional Declaration in the PC.

Post-Entry Requirements :

1. MAQIS officer(s) will take the sample at the point of entry and send to National Post Entry Quarantine Serdang, Malaysia for further analysis to monitor any pests, diseases and other regulated articles.
2. If any pests, diseases and other regulated articles are detected during the post-entry quarantine analysis, DoA have the right to suspend the future importation until the cause of the non-compliance is investigated, identified and rectified to the satisfaction of DoA Malaysia.
3. All cost incurred during PEQ will be fully borne by the importer.
